The Nicene Creed (BCP 358) (please stand)

Invitation to and Administration of Holy Communion

All baptized Christians are welcome and invited to receive Holy Communion. The clergy will place the consecrated wafer in your outstretched, cupped hands. You may consume the wafer if you don't wish to receive the wine; otherwise the eucharistic minister will pick up the wafer from your hand, dip it in the wine, and place it on your tongue.
